This past August marked the 20th anniversary of the first educational program aboard the pungy schooner *LADY MARYLAND*. To celebrate the event, Living Classrooms Foundation (www.livingclassrooms.org) will be throwing *Sail-a-bration* at the Pier Six Concert Pavilion in Baltimore on October 8, from 1-7 pm. The festivities will include a reunion of past crewmembers and the building crew. Additionally, there will be three bands on hand, kids activities and no shortage of excellent food and drink! A silent auction and raffle will round out the festivities, with all proceeds going toward another 20 years of hands-on education aboard *LADY MARYLAND* and the Living Classrooms fleet.

LADY MARYLAND is the only pungy schooner sailing today. Designed by Thomas C. Gillmer and built by a crew led by Master shipwright G. Peter Boudreau, she is a replica of the local cargo schooners that hauled perishable goods on the Bay during the 19th and early 20th centuries. Since 1986, *LADY MARYLAND* has sailed with tens of thousands of students between the Chesapeake Bay and the Great Lakes. Each summer for the past eleven years she has been a fixture along the coast of New England, as students onboard for her educational voyages study estuaries and whale ecology. At other times of the year, she works with students of all ages, backgrounds and abilities, including youth at risk and physically and emotionally challenged students.
