What is *The Roseway*?

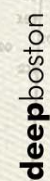
Come aboard *The Roseway* at Rowes Wharf, a 137' ft. beautifully restored, schooner. Built in Essex, Massachusetts at the turn of the 20th Century, this registered U.S. National Historic Landmark serves as home for the World Ocean School.

The term is used more generally to describe seamen as compared with officers, in phrases such as "he sailed before the mast before rising in the ranks."
